Well, hoping everyone has stayed healthy and well. Since I had time on my hands to do something out of the monotony, I decided to finish something that was started over 45 years ago. Before Jo and our family moved back to California, we had a 10-year stint in Minneapolis. In the winter (6 months of it!) you had to do something inside. I liked to build model airplanes, some that flew with gas engines some just for show. One Christmas or Birthday, I don't really remember, the kids and Jo gave me the biggest model I ever took on. A 1/32 scale model of a B17 G Super Fortress. The significance of this plane is that Jo's father was a B17 pilot in the Army Air Corps in the 40's.

I started the model about 1975 and due to family and career, never completed it. We moved to San Diego in 1977 and I have packed and dragged the partially completed model around all of these years. So.... Enter stay at home social distancing etc. I got the model down and started to work on it a little every few days or so. It is a balsa wood and silk paper skin construction. I probably spent as much time repairing fragile breaks and tears as I did on actual new build. As you can imagine, materials 45-years-old, like our bodies deteriorate. It was fun getting creative and making some parts from scratch. The decals were trash and I searched the web and found replacement scale model decals. The kit did not come with scale model propellers. Again, it took me a few days but finally found some that would work.

The plane is not perfect, but rather kind of looks like it has seen combat action. I think it is cool and the satisfaction of finally completing the project started so many years ago was rewarding, especially in the unprecedented times we all are experiencing. I hope that maybe my project will help some of you do something you have been putting off and inspire you to complete or accomplish a rewarding experience too.

NCoCC Corvette Racing Report

The second race of the IMSA GTLM season was run at Daytona in what is going to be a very strange season with the COVID restrictions. I am happy to report that the #3 car (Yellow) won the six car GTLM Race of 2 hours and 40 minutes, called the "Daytona 240." The 100th Win for Corvette Racing in the IMSA yearly series. The first race of the season was the regularly scheduled "24 hours of Daytona," but then the COVID-19 outbreak threw the season into turmoil, which will in all likelihood continue throughout the season with shifting schedules. So it is a little strange that the first two races were run on the same track, one with crowds and one without. One being 24 hours and the other 2.6 hours.

Never-the-less a WIN is a WIN, and the #3 car came across the finish line approximately 2 seconds out in front of the #912 Porsche. While in the final laps it appeared that they were going on a fuel conscious Porsche, at a rate of a half second per lap, that linear rate did not maintain in the final lap. Antonio Garcia was the driver for the final segment and he was in control of what was his first win in three years; and the first win for Corvette Racing in 2 years.

Sebring 240 July 18, 2020

Corvette wins 2 in a row; this time the #4 car came across the line, just in front of the #3. The #912 crossed in 3rd. So the #3 car is AHEAD in points for the COVID season. The major move in the race was in the pits; but not in the usual way. It was all on Porsche; handing the 1, 2 finish to Corvette.

GUIDE DOGS FOR THE BLIND (GDB) REPORT


Hi there,
