- 1. The first Corvette was introduced at Motorama (in 1953).
- 2. They are named after a type of warship; enlightenment era warships.
- 3. Corvette has won many awards; the biggest being the Best Engineered Car of the 20th Century.
- 4. Three NASA Astronauts drove Corvettes; Alan Shepard, Bus Grissom and Gordon Cooper.
- 5. Almost half of all Corvette Owners have college degrees.
- 6. New Corvettes are fast in reverse (but the fastest is a Nissan Leaf).
- 7. Fastest Corvette motor was made in 1968; the 1968 LT-2.
- 8. Corvette pioneered the wraparound windshields.
- 9. The Corvette's original logo was different. It originally included an American Flag but this was illegal.
- 10. Only one 1983 model Corvette exists; it resides at the museum.
- 11. Prince wrote "Little Red Corvette" when he fell asleep in a backup singer's Mercury Montclair Marauder.
- 12. First commercial vehicles were constructed of only fiberglass.
- 13. The 1953 debut only had two options; a heater and an AM radio.
- 14. A Corvette car beat established racers at Le Mans with a C5-R.
- 15. The original designer was inspired by European cars.
- 16. There were no manual Corvettes in 1982.
- 17. The Corvette Stingray was inspired by a real shark that Bill Mitchell caught while on a fishing expedition.
- 18. The Corvette is the official sports car of Kentucky.
- 19. The biggest (by displacement) motor was a Big-Block.
- 20. The Corvette ZR1 had a motor designed by boat engineers.

GUIDE DOGS FOR THE BLIND (GDB) REPORT


Hello everyone!
