GUIDE DOGS FOR THE BLIND (GDB) REPORT

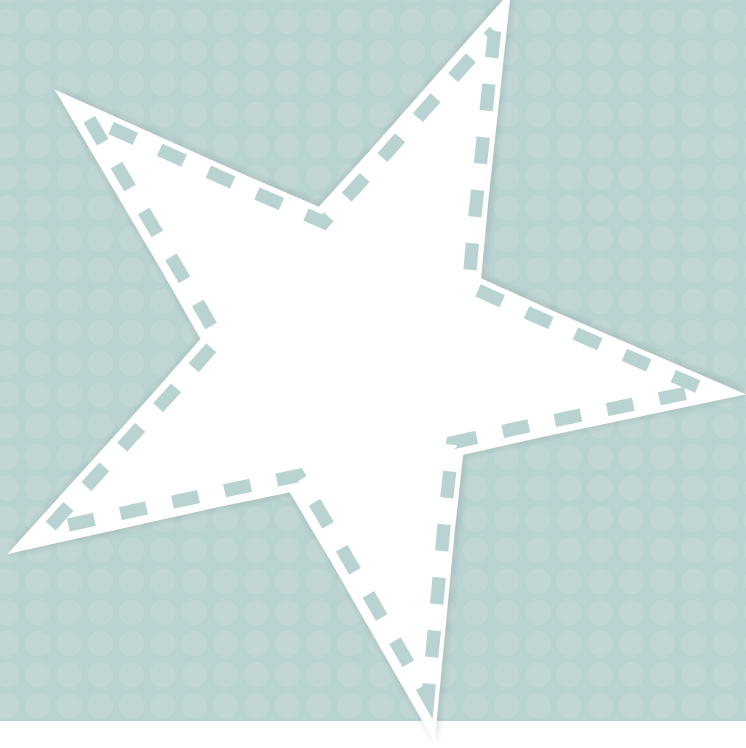
Hi everyone,

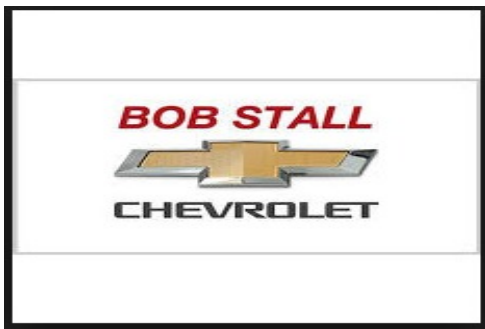
