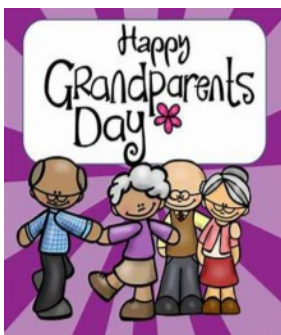

Corvette Owners School – ZR1 Training August 23-24, 2020 Rosemary Dymek



Just wanted to share my experiences while attending the Ron Fellows Performance Driving School at the Spring Mountain Motor Resort in Pahrump, Nevada.

The Corvette ZR1 owners school was definitely the experience of a lifetime! I thought the COS Z06 school was amazing, but this one far exceeded my expectations! Each day started out with classroom instruction focusing on car control exercises, corner approaching techniques, braking and downshifting exercises and then continuing on to driving time on the exhilarating road courses. One of the most important elements was to learn the ABS system and the important role it plays in determining whether you stop the vehicle on the track or lose it in the dirt! You gain knowledge and confidence in yourself, but excessive speed, the wrong line, overdriving the curve....you name it...it can happen and you can lose control! This is why it was so important to have confidence both in yourself as well as the Corvette you were driving.

I left the training definitely feeling more knowledgeable and a lot more confident "performance" driver! I didn't want to leave....and I could go on forever praising the driving school, but the only way you can appreciate it is by attending the Corvette Owners School yourself!

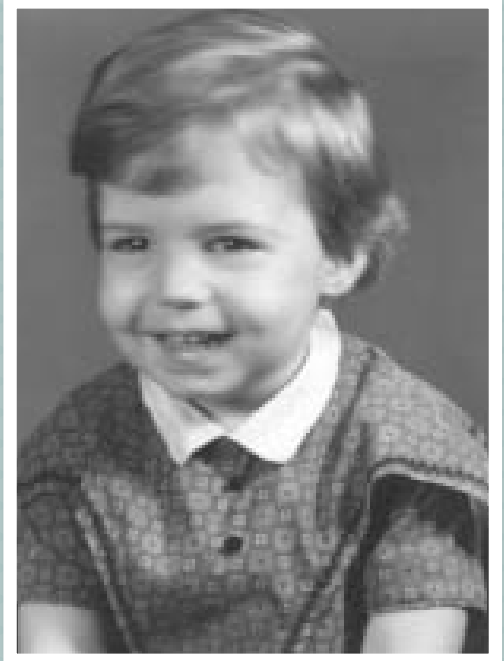

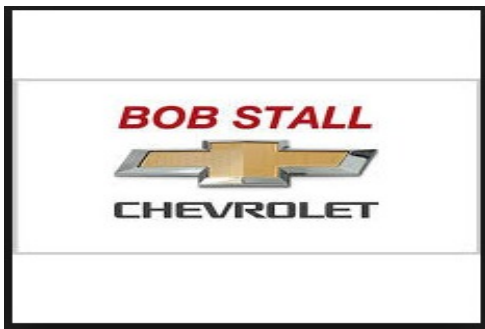
