

San Diego Automotive Museum Gala “Get Your Kicks on Route 66”



On Saturday, January 18, 2014, the San Diego Automotive Museum had its fundraising gala to celebrate its 25th anniversary and raise money to support the museum and its programs. COCSD breaks the tie and takes home the trophy!



60 Years of Cool

After years of uninspired design and performance, the Corvette came into its own in its fifth generation. The C5 Corvette was a higher-quality car than the one it replaced, and performance was much better both in a straight line and through turns. A new all-aluminum LS1 5.7-liter V8 engine boosted output from 330 to 345 horsepower and dropped the zero-to-60 mph time from 5.1 to 4.8 seconds. The new rear transaxle improved weight balance, and the new perimeter frame chassis was stronger than in previous 'Vettes. Only a hatchback coupe was offered for 1997; the convertible returned for '98.



The C5-R was the first officially sanctioned race car in Corvette's history. Built to compete in the American Le Mans Series' GTS class, the race car shared much in common with the street car, including the frame and engine block, but its carbon-fiber bodywork was 4 inches wider, and at 600 horsepower it cranked out 255 more ponies. In its debut, the C5-R placed third in the GT2 class at the Rolex 24 Hours of Daytona. Subsequent C5-R and C6-R race cars have won at Le Mans and claimed multiple manufacturers' championships.



National Corvette Museum News:

Forthcoming Racetrack already has 118 Events Booked

The four-year odyssey to build a motorsports park at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, across from the Corvette assembly plant, is eight months away from completion. It was 2010 when the plan was announced to build a complex of two road courses totaling 3.1 miles, a kart track, a 10-acre autocross course and a quarter-mile drag strip on 184 acres of land next to I-65. An architect was hired in 2012, and the latest word is that workers will begin laying the road base in spring so that the \$35 million facility opens in time for the museum's 20th anniversary in August this year.

Observers aren't waiting until August to pay attention, though. CNN has already put the facility at #17 on its 50 States, 50 Spots for 2014 list, and the park's blog says it already has 118 events booked. Having been told that this is a non-denominational racetrack - it is open to any cars, not just Corvettes - it's looking like a great start for more racing in the heartland.
