EYE LEVEL

CHANGE PERSPECTIVE,
TAKE A KNEE

We, as people, tend to see the world from one perspective: about 5 1/2 feet above the ground—known as eye level. This has been our viewpoint for a few

millennia, so it's no surprise that when cameras are broken out to shoot, they're usually raised to our eye. That's fine when shooting something on the scale of a building, but Mecum Auctions doesn't deal in buildings. Vehicles are our thing. Photographing a car is different than capturing a structure, and one of the easiest ways to improve your car photography is to kneel.

I'm talking about lowering the camera. Get it closer to the ground. Vehicles look better when the vantage point is lower. How low? As a general rule, start

with the camera at the same level as the top of the fenders. Immediately, the car will look more aggressive. If you want to try something a little more daring, try bringing the camera lower yet, to bumper level. Some vehicles work better with the camera a little higher, some a little lower. Experiment—digital photography gives you the luxury of instant feedback, and when you find the perfect height, shoot away.

Another benefit of a lower camera position is

that the car can act as a shield. It's surprising just how much unwanted background your vehicle can

hide when the camera is lowered. The best background for any car is one that complements the subject, but doesn't pull the viewer's attention away from the vehicle. The fountain in the park down the street might be a work of art, but what do you want your viewer to look at? Your car, or the fountain? By bringing the camera closer to Mother Earth, the background can often be minimized or completely hidden.

So don't be afraid to shoot at eye level—just lower your eye level. Then watch the quality of your images climb!


The Board authorized seed money for me to use to start making the purchases online and at stores in the area, so I don't have to worry about making all of the purchases at the last minute.
