We had quite a few vendors at the show who all seemed to be happy with the outcome of the show. The food was pretty good and there was hot coffee too in the morning.

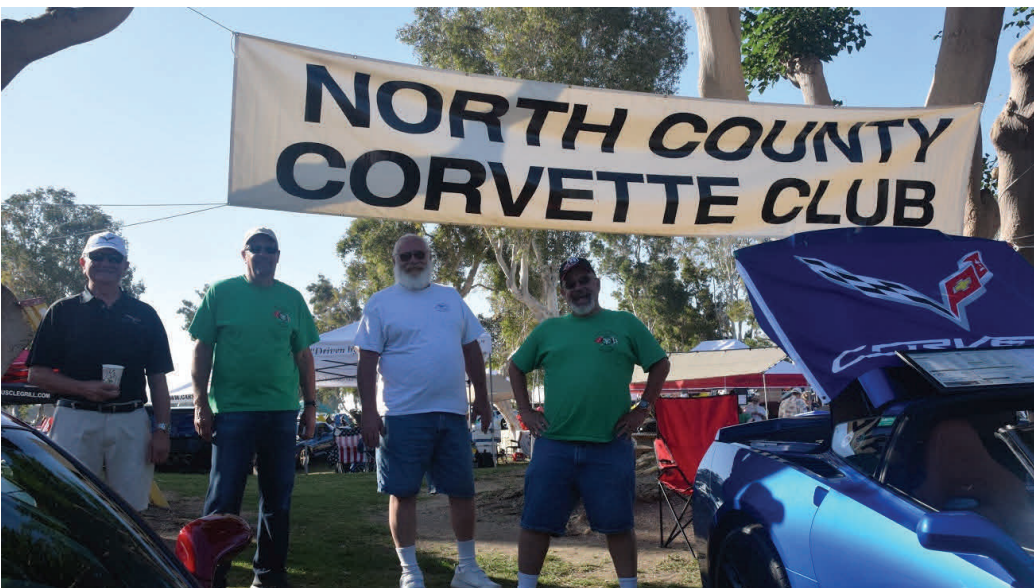
The editor of Corvette Online was there with his red Corvette. I haven't looked for his column yet but it's sure to be a good one.
