

# **60 Years of Cool**

The Corvettes first complete redesign came in 1963, when it became the Stingray. The new model added its first coupe body style – the stunning split window design – as well as an independent rear suspension and air conditioning. The 327-cubic-inch V8 engine made as much as 360 horse power when ordered with fuel injection. The split window lasted only one year due to complaints about visibility, buy the coupe body style was here to stay, and the 1963-67 Corvettes would go down as the most beautiful in the marque's history.
